Hugh Cushnie has been a stalwart of our club, tremendously influential in its development, and was instrumental with his fishing friends at the very start of the club. In the key acquisition of river beats Hugh played a key role and was with others from the area highly energetic in the fund raising efforts that enabled the club to purchase key fishings including the beautiful stretch of the Upper Blackwater above Rogie Falls (see press cutting page 2). Hugh has served the on the club's executive committee continuously and carried all the Office Bearer positions at various times over the years.

Presenting Hugh with an engraved decanter the club chairman, Stephen Dowds said it had been a great pleasure to work with Hugh. He had been the first LAAC member that he had met when out exploring the River Conon fishings. adding that he had been a hugely valuable mentor to him since he joined the committee in 2010. He always consulted Hugh when tricky issues came up and was well advised at all times. He warmly thanked him for his dedication to the club and this was received with acclamation by the committee members pictured above.

In thanking the club committee for this award Hugh spoke eloquently of the club's development years, the people who had helped him throughout, the extent of the fund raising, maintenance work, and in doing so gave the committee members a detailed history lesson of Loch Achonachie Angling Club. PIKE FISHING

There is an increasing interest in fly fishing for Pike amongst members and visitors. Club member Scott McMath this caught pike this spring from the boat on Loch Achonachie. He was fly fishing for the species and tells the newsletter it was caught using a silver perch imitation on a fast sinking line in the margins close to a weed bed. He also had a follow right to the boat later in the day by a much bigger pike but it turned away at the last minute! Spinning or fly fishing for pike – remember no treble hooks these days and always NO BAIT FISHING





LOWER CONON DADAC

Dingwall club's Brian Morrison caught this fantastic salmon, pictured here on the right, whilst fishing late in April. It was Brian's first ever Salmon on the fly, caught on a size 8 double Black & Yellow fly and weighing in at 28.5lb this silver springer was landed with the help of Liam Mutch. A solitary scale (pictured below) was recovered at the scene and this was passed onto fishery board staff to see if they could establish its age. It was estimated that the fish has spent 3 years in freshwater before migrating to sea as a smolt before spending a further 3 years at sea before returning to spawn.





Out on first day of the season in February on the Digwall & District AC stretch of the Conon was Jimmy Mutch, taking the first cast of the seaon on opening day.

"I had a great two days in mid-May exploring some of the trout fishing the hills of Assynt had to offer. I spent two days camping and fishing some of the more remote waters available on the Assynt Angling club exchange ticket. Despite cool windy weather the fishing was fantastic with fish coming to traditional wets and static dry flies. I caught plenty, however was very surprised with the quality and size of fish in some waters. I managed several around the 1.5lb mark, which fought incredibly hard for their size. I also lost a much larger fish that headed straight out for deeper waters before shaking the hook, a good reason to go back!"
